Scotland, with 5,144,220 people, is the land situated in northern Britain. There are beautiful mountains, coastlines and islands in that region. The capital city is Edinburgh, but it isn't the largest city in Scotland. The patron of this region is St Andrew.

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England is placed on the most of the island. Its capital is one of the largest cities in Europe – London. This country's patron is St George. In the Lake District there are rivers, hills, valleys while in the south we can relax on sandy beaches. England has 51,092,002 inhabitants.

Finally, Wales with its capital-Cardiff and patron St David. The area is famous for its many castles. The number of citizens has reached 3,004,600.

Give teens a break!

Teenage years are filled with all kinds of problems-lack of self-confidence, nagging parents, peer pressure, doing well in the exams and getting into university. Some of their problems result from the emotional and physical changes teenagers are going through. Teenagers are extremely concerned about their appearance. So, it's no wonder they spend so much time in front of the mirror! They notice every single thing about themselves – their body changing shape, hair appearing in unlikely places, annoying sports breaking out. Teenagers are rarely happy about these changes which can affect how they feel about themselves. Sometimes, parents hurt their teenage children's feelings by making jokes about their appearance. They also tend to pay little attention to teenage worries and think of them as being silly.

Your daughter may be convinced that her nose looks awful and that plastic surgery is the only solution even though everybody else fails to notice the problem. By trying to explain that other people do not normally pay as much attention to our physical features as we do ourselves, we can help teenagers feel better about themselves and become more confident. Teenagers also tend to avoid doing things they don't like, especially helping around the house. They are likely to try to get out of doing household chores - and certainly don't respond well to orders. The more you discuss the type of household chore your teenage son or a daughter might not mind doing, the better. He or she, for example, may be happy to go to the supermarket, but hate the idea of washing dishes.

It also works better if your children can, at least to some degree, do things in their own way and time. This might seem annoying, but if all you do is order them around, you can be sure that next time they will not do a thing.

Always thank your children for their effort. And if they do something that's more than just a simple chore-decorating, perhaps you might want to pay them.

Student Has Old Hilton Cell Number

For months, Shirley Barlow's cell phone was flooded with wrong-number calls and text messages, mostly between 2 and 4a.m. On weekends. When they were told they phoned a college student, the people who called did not believe it.

“Baby girl, how are you?” one man purred in a foreign accent. “Why are you doing this?” a woman asked. “This is so rude.” And there were several accidental references to “Paris.” As in Paris Hilton.

Barlow's story began on Valentine's Day during a night out with friends. She was carrying her phone in a back pocket when it fell into toilet. When she replaced it, her phone company gave her a new number with 310 area code rather than 415. Barlow received a recycled phone number that used to be Hilton's.

The practice comes from efforts to save phone numbers not to create too many area-codes.

Just after Barlow got her new phone, close to February 17 birthday, “which is Hilton's birthday, an outbreak of calls and texts arrived. “Oh my God,” one caller said. “Where's the party?”

Then came the day Hilton was sentenced to jail after violating probation in an alcohol-related driving case. Messages about parties were replaced by dozens expressing condolences.

“People were scared for her,” Barlow said.

The phone traffic got smaller when Hilton went to jail last month. But when Hilton was released, a new flood of messages came.

“It's disgusting how they treated you in there, but once again you have showed the world that you can do anything,” one wrote.

Barlow said she has resisted the temptation to pose as Hilton to get into exclusive parties. But she did message supporters “thanks so much,” believing Hilton would appreciate it.

Barlow plans to keep the number because she says it has been a greater source of fun than a problem.

“It was really because I was lazy,” she added. “ I didn't want to change my telephone number again.”
